<b>WHAT WILL BE THE DISASTER?</b> What misfortune will befall the hero as the result of his attempts to achieve her objective?
<b>WHAT'S THE CONFLICT?</b> What conflict will result from the hero's reaction to the disaster? And what is the logical flow of cause and effect that will allow this conflict to continue throughout the story?

## PART 2 - STORY ARC

<b>EXPOSITION</b> The beginning part of the story. It's where the author introduces you into the world and its characters. It lays the groundwork of the rest of the story.
<b>RISING ACTION</b> A series of relevant events that creates suspense. It includes all decisions, characters' flaws, and background circumstances that together create turns and twists leading to a climax.
<b>CLIMAX</b> The most intense and exciting part of the story. This is the whole point of the story, everything your rising action has been leading up to.
<b>FALLING ACTION</b> Falling action wraps up the narrative, resolves its loose ends, and leads toward the resolution. It tells the aftermath of the climax in the story.
<b>RESOLUTION</b> This is the end of the story. How is the problem solved? What happens in the end? At this point, all the questions from the climax should be answered.
