NOTE: Before adjectives + noun, there is normally a **determiner** which may be an article, number, or something else that introduces the noun.

EXAMPLES: the ancient blue deadly dinosaur | a wonderful large round Greek marble table three beautiful slender sisters | their silver extraterrestrial metal weapons | a tiny shopping cart
